Spotlight artist

TeeJay Jones | Pastel

BORN IN JAMAICA, QUEENS, TeeJay holds a BA with honors in Art Education from Pratt Institute and a Masters in Administrative/ Educational Leadership from Walden University. A self-taught artist, he has been painting for over 4 decades. Never actually having a studio,

he paints wherever he can find a space in his home. His passion lies in creating art, as well as is in teaching it, and his work has been privately commissioned.

TeeJay uses traditional mediums (which include pastels, acrylics and oils) but favors pastel. TeeJay has an uncanny realism that conveys the human anatomy. He is currently the Education Administrative Supervisor as well as the art teacher at the Barry Robinson Center in Norfolk. A native of New York City, he now resides in Virginia Beach.

When did you first realize that you're an artist?

I'm not sure if ever I felt like an artist as much as I felt like I loved creating art. I remember dedicating myself to this way of life when I was in about 7th grade. I saw that I had a love for creativity and had some ability. It was then that people around me started to notice my ability. It was that appreciation, encouragement and self-acknowledgment that lead me to continue working as an artist.

Why did you choose your particular medium?

I was like other kids at the time who primarily used

pencil. Eventually, I delved into painting and pastels. It was not until I went to Pratt Institute that I started doing sculptures in stone and realized that I loved the idea of using my hands. Having used pastels for a while, it too allowed me to get that same satisfaction of using my hands to create my paintings. I found that I loved the feeling of rubbing pastels on paper but loved (to an even greater extent) working with pastels on canvas. Since then, I never looked back.

What is your creative process?

We, as individuals, are drawn to the human form.

The body's movement, beauty and strength appeal to us in many different ways. The human form has a quality and beauty that transcends time. I work from photos of individual models in many different poses and each pose from many different angles. When a pose that seems to be more natural and intimate captures a sense of aloneness, that's when I begin.

I want to show that sense of solo intimacy as if subject is allowing me to be in their space at a moment when they feel they are alone to be themselves without pretense. That's what I try to capture in my work.

Who influenced you the most?

As a realist, Ernie Barnes, Augusta Savage and Leonardo da Vinci were my initial influences. Frank Frazetta and, most recently, Kehinde Wiley have really grabbed my attention.

What advice would you give a beginning artist?

I would make the point that it's important to continuously

learn. Try different things until you find that one approach that represents you. Do it because you love it.

Don't be discouraged by the disappointments in your work. Those are the times thatshould make you work harder. More importantly, don't let others' negative opinions get in the way. I live by this quote (though I forgot who said it): "The harder I work, the luckier I get." Just keep working hard and stay committed, eventually you will break through.

What are you working on now?

I'm still involved in this series of female moments. My next piece involves three female dancers, each of different nationalities. Showing people of different cultures is very important to me.



What better place to learn the art of Plein Air painting than beautiful, scenic Tuscany?

WHO DOESN'T HAVE a bucket list these days? I have been fortunate to have traveled extensively in my lifetime. Once, while visiting the town of Cinque Terra, we came upon a group of Plein Air painters. I was rooted in my tracks. I could have stayed and watched them for hours but the tour needed to move on. As an artist, I knew I would come back one day and paint Italy.

I follow an artist on Facebook, Maggie Renner Hellman, who



instructs and she had a trip planned to teach In Posaro. It was at an artist retreat called The Watermill in Tuscany. After reviewing the website it checked off all my boxes and I got excited about the opportunity to visit. Then Covid happened and for the next two years my dream trip would have to wait until the end of May 2022.

We landed in Pisa and spent overnight there to take in the beautiful sites and enjoy the food and wine of the region. The next day we

boarded a train to Fivizzono where we were met by a van to take us to the Inn. The owners Lois and Bill Breckon greeted us personally with a champagne toast and a tour of the estate. Our stay there was exceptional. The staff was most accommodating and friendly and the food and wine were abundant and delicious. The views from our two balconies were stunningly beautiful.

We set out each morning after a nice breakfast to a different location everyday. Our

instructor, Maggie, gave us a demo and then was available for help with design, color mixing, and guidance for plein air painting. This was new to me as I had mostly painted with oils in the studio. Although more challenging, it allowed me to be in nature and really SEE color and light. I learned how to see the big shapes first and to use a big brush. Photographs can be deceiving and nothing compares to being on location. We had

lunch at either small local restaurants or by picnic with wine, of course. Then we went back to the Inn which had a lovely open air studio with the sounds and sites of the river that flowed to the Mill underneath. The studio was always open for continued work on your pieces. But I soon realized that plein air painting was more about composition, color note taking, and enjoying being in nature rather than coming up with a finished piece. These studies can be used in the studio to either be refined or to use as a references for a larger studio piece.

It was truly an all-encompassing experience for me. I had my art, my supportive husband, my new artist friends, exceptional food and wine, and the gorgeous Italian country side. I did not come back with any masterpieces but I did come back with newfound friends, love for Italian cooking, and a new appreciation for all the talented Plein Air painters I follow. I would highly recommend branching out of your comfort zone to explore new countries, new lifestyles, and to follow what is in your heart. Explore, see, taste, and enjoy your passion for art through travel and learning opportunities. I would highly recommend the Watermill in Tuscany as an artistic outlet and a most enjoyable vacation.
